Master of Commerce (M.COM) (2021 Pattern) **Program Structure**

For Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) Under Autonomy

(Semester Pattern)

With effect from June 2021

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1. INTRODUCTION:

The M.Com Degree Course (2021 pattern) will be introduced in the following order:-

- **a.** First Year M.Com. 2021-2022
- **b.** Second Year M.Com. 2022-2023

M.Com. Degree Course will consist of four semesters divided into two Years. The first year (Semester I and II) and Second Year (Semester III and IV), Choice Based Credit System Examination and Semester end examination will be held at the end of each semester.

2. OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE:

- a. To equip and train Post Graduate students to accept the challenges of business world by providing opportunities for study and analysis of advanced commercial and business methods and processes.
- b. To develop independent logical thinking and facilitate personality development.
- c. To equip the students to seek suitable careers in management and entrepreneurship.
- d. To acquaint students with significance of research in business.
- e. To impart skills regarding methods of data collection and their interpretations.
- f. To develop communication and analytical skills among students.

3. ELIGIBILITY:

The student who has passed any Bachelor's degree from any recognized University shall be held eligible to be admitted to M.Com Course.

4. **DURATION:**

The M.Com. Course will be of Two Years duration consisting of two parts. i.e. Part I and Part II. Each part is having Two Semesters. Thus, the M.Com Course is of four Semesters. For each Semester, there will be Four Papers of 100 marks each. M.Com Degree will be of 1600 marks in aggregate.

5. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The Medium of instruction for M.com Degree course shall be English.

6. SCHEME OF CREDITS (ACADEMIC/CGPA):

The M.Com degree course will be of two years duration consisting of four semesters and of minimum 64 credits as below:

In each Semester, there will be four papers of 100 marks each out of which **50 marks** will be for Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and **50 marks for Semester End** Examination (SEE)

9. ATTENDANCE:

No candidate shall be allowed to appear for the semester end examinations unless he/she has not less than 75% of attendance in each semester.

10. COLLEGE TERMS:

The dates for the commencement and conclusion of the first and the second terms shall be defined by the College Authorities. Only duly admitted students can keep the terms. The present relevant Ordinances pertaining to grant of terms will be applicable.

11. STANDARD OFPASSING:

- a. A Student must obtain a minimum of 40% Marks in Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and minimum 40% marks in Semester End Examination.
- b. It means Passing separately in Internal Assessment and Semester end Examination is compulsory.
- c. A student who fails in Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) or Semester End Examination or BOTH of any semesters can re-appear for the same in the next semester. Eg: students failed in 1st semester can reappear in 2nd semester.

12. Method Of Evaluation, Passing, And Evaluation Criteria:

The evaluation of students will be done on three parameters:

- a. Continuous internal Evaluation (CIE)
- b. Semester End Examination
- c. Research Project Examination(SEM IV)

a. CONTINUOUS INTERNAL EVALUATION (CIE)

Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) will be of 50 marks. These 50 marks are divided as follows:

NOTE FOR CIE IV: The Course teacher will adopt any three out of the following methods for the Continuous Internal Evaluation under CIE IV, each carrying 5 marks.

- c. Mini Research Projects
- d. Research Paper Presentations
- e. Library Assignments
- f. Group Discussions
- g. Research Articles
- h. E-Poster Presentation
 - **b. SEMESTER END EXAMINATION (SEE) The question papers will be set for fifty marks (2 Hours duration) at the end of each semester.** There shall be four semester examinations: first semester examination at the middle of the first academic year and the second semester examination at the end of the first academic year. Similarly, the third and fourth semester examinations shall be held at the middle and the end of the second academic year respectively.

c. RESEARCH PROJECT WORK:

There will be a Research Project to be prepared by a student during the fourth semester. The objective of the project work is to introduce students to research methodology in the subject and prepare them for pursuing research in theoretical or experimental or computational areas of the subject. The project work is to be undertaken under guidance of a teacher allotted to a student by the department.

- a. As the Research Project is based on the self-study done by the candidate and evaluated for 100 marks altogether, having four credits. The project will be evaluated by two Examiners (Internal and External).
- b. The Students have to submit the project 20 days before the Commencement of the fourth semester-End Examination. The project report shall be type-written and submitted in original along with a soft copy of the entire project which is to be emailed to the concerned Research Guide. A student who fails to submit the project may resubmit the same in the subsequent semester examination for evaluation. The project work activities must be duly supported by documentary evidence to be endorsed by the Head or Guide.

15. GRADE POINTS SCHEME:

The term grading system indicates a 10 – points scale of evaluation of the performance of students in terms of marks obtained in the Internal and Semester End Examination, grade points and letter grade. The total performance within a semester and continuous performance starting from the first semester are indicated respectively by Grade Point Average (GPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA). Candidates who pass all the examinations prescribed for the course in the first appearance itself alone are eligible for Ranking.

The 10-point scale would be used to convert marks out of 100 to grades and grade points according to the following table:

16. STRUCTURE OF TRANSCRIPT:

At the end of each semester, student will be given a transcript showing the performance and result in each course. The transcript shows, for each course the title of the course, credit values, grade in Semester End examination, grade in Internal Evaluation, grade point index, result as pass or fail. Also, the semester grade point average (SGPA) and cumulative grade point average (CPGA) will be shown. Further the equivalent percentage of marks corresponding to SGPG or CGPA to equivalent percentage is given by:

10 x CGPA if CGPA /SGPA is in [4.00, 6.00]

Equivalent percentage marks= 05 x CGPA + 30 if CGPA /SGPA is in [6.00, 9.00]

25 x CGPA - 150 if CGPA /SGPA is in [9.00, 10.00]

17. AWARD OF CLASS:

a. The class in respect of M.Com. Examination will be awarded on the basis of aggregate marks obtained by the candidates in all the sixteen papers at the Semester I, II, III, and IV together.

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18. A.T.K.T RULES:

- a. If a Student fails in all the courses of semester I shall be allowed to proceed with Semester II. However a student who fails in not more than 50% of all the courses at Semester I & II taken together can be admitted to Semester III & IV
- b. 50% of all courses includes both (CGPA and Non- CGPA Courses)

19. VERIFICATION AND REVALUATION:

The student can apply for verification and revaluation of Semester End examination result through Principal of the College which will be done by the college as per ordinances framed in this behalf.

20. IMPROVEMENT OF CLASS OR GRADE:

- a. A Candidate will be allowed to re-appear for the examination for improvement of Class or grade within a period of 2 years from the date of his/her passing Master's degree examination. Only 1 attempt for improvement will be allowed, according to the syllabus in existence.
- b. A Candidate shall have to reappear for minimum 1/3rd and /or maximum all the courses at a time on which the class is awarded.
- c. A Candidate who has appeared for improvement of class and fails to improve his/her class, his/her performance at such reappearance shall be ignored.
- d. A Candidate appearing for the improvement of Class grade shall not be entitled to be in the list of Rank holders/ Merit.
- e. Improved Candidate will have to surrender the degree, Statement of marks, passing certificate in original, after the declaration of their results of the concerned improved class. After surrendering the above documents in original, new certificate will be issued in due course of time as in usual process.

21. Term of Course:

- a. The existing relevant ordinances will be applicable i.e. N+2
- b. The maximum duration to complete the Masters of Commerce Program will be (N+2), i.e (2+2) years to complete the M.com Program.
- c. The student will have to take fresh admission to M.com -I, if HE/SHE fails to complete the M.com degree in 4 years.
